



BBJ awarded

The Braith Burn and Jessop Construction Company Limited (BBJ), a central public sector undertaking under the ministry of heavy industry, has been awarded with the Turnaround CPSE Award 2010 by BRPSE, department of public enterprise, govt of India in an award ceremony held at SCOPE Bhawan, New Delhi recently. S Baul, managing director, BBJ received the award from Dr Nitish Sengupta, chairman, BRPSE. BBJ which was formed initially to construct the then Howrah Bridge (Rabindra Setu) has since built almost all the major bridges for Indian Railways such as Ganga Bridge in Bihar, Godavari Bridge in Andhra Pradesh, Brahmaputra Bridge in Assam, DMRC Project in Delhi etc. which are engineering marvels. BBJ has also constructed the only Cable Stayed Bridge over the river Hooghly at Kolkata with state-of-the-art technology. Presently BBJ is constructing one of the major rail-cum-road bridges with an approx length of 4 km over river Ganga at Munger, Bihar. In a way BBJ is bridging the nation from east to west and north to south. During the last five years the company's performance has been remarkable, showing appreciable growth in terms of turnover and profitability. The company has registered more than 40 % growth in the current year compared to 2009-10.
