INSTRUCTION TO BIDDERS

1. **SUBMISSION OF TENDER** shall be read in conjunction with General Commercial Terms and conditions and any other documents forming part of this Tender Document wherever the context so requires. Notwithstanding the sub-division of the documents into the separate section, every part of each shall be deemed to be supplementary to and complementary to every other part and shall be read with the document so far as it may be practicable to do so wherever it is mentioned that the Sub-Contractor shall perform certain work or provide certain facilities, it is understood that the Sub-Contractor shall do so at their cost.

2. LANGUAGE

Bids and all accompanying document shall be in English. In case any accompanying documents are in other language, it shall be accompanied by an English translation. The English version shall prevail in matter of interpretation.

3. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- a) Firms having experience of Completion of one work of fabrication of welded steel girder, which includes welding by SAW Machine and under strict quality procedures, during last 5 years.
- b) Any firm who does not qualify technically may enter into a TECHNICAL TIE-UP /MOU with another firm having technical expertise and past experience of doing similar bridge work through an agreement. The partners of the said MOU to be jointly and severally responsible for fulfillment of the contractual obligation.

4. JOINT VENTURE CRITERION

- a) Company or firm fulfilling the Techno-commercial and other qualifying criteria strictly as per the requirements published in the NIT and spelt out in this tender document is only eligible to submit quotation.
- b) In case of necessity, two or more companies or firms forming Joint Venture (JV) by means of agreement (whether registered or not) for Techno- Financial Synergy and/or for any commercial consideration is eligible to submit quotation provided :
 - i) A new entity is formed and goes by a new name.

INSTRUCTION TO BIDDERS

- ii) The said new entity is conclusively and distinctively complies with all qualification criteria set for the job published in this NIT.
- iii) The terms of the JV would be such as to sufficiently protect or safeguard contingencies as to breach of contract etc. by one or more partners in course of or during tendency of execution of contract by the JV and have provisions as such binding upon the JV partners inter-se as insurance for execution and determination of contract.

SCOPE OF WORK

1. SCOPE OF FABRICATION :

For Site fabrication of 9780 MT Bridge Girder and components at BBJ's Ganga Bridge site near Munger(Bihar). The list given below is only indicative and the work is to be carried out in accordance with tender/contract conditions, approved drawings and direction of BBJ/E.C. Railway/their authorized representative. The job content (in general but may not be limited to):

- a) Taking delivery of raw steel from BBJ's stack yard or any other place at site as per instruction of BBJ, transport to designated place of fabrication, proper stacking, handling etc.
- b) Preparation (including welding of bushes) of working jigs from master plate/jigs, preparation of fixtures.
- c) Preparation of temporary arrangement required for straightening / welding / assembling etc.
- d) Fabrication of open web bridge girder / it's components including marking, cutting, straightening, fitting, assembling, welding, riveting, grinding, end milling all complete as per drawing / instruction of BBJ. Tentative Span wise scope (may vary as per discretion of SIC/BBJ):
 - i) All members of 4(four spans);

20 (twenty) months from the date of LOI or work order whichever is earlier for the entire Scope of Work. In case of splitting of the scope of work, suitable delivery period will be decided by BBJ depending on the quantum of work. The specified Completion Time shall be the essence of the Contract.

SCOPE OF WORK

6. PROGRAMME and PROGRESS:

Within two weeks from receipt of LOI, the agency will submit detail programme to SIC/BBJ and get the same modified and finalised as per requirement of BBJ. In the first week of every month, the agency will submit a report showing actual progress achieved up to last month against target along with recovery plan in case any shortfall is noted. Further review(s) showing actual progress may be done at any stage by BBJ.

7. GENERAL SPECIFICATIONS & TERMS:

The specification, terms & conditions in general, which is needed to be followed for the scope of work of the agency, will be as per the enclosed relevant extracts of contract document between BBJ and Railways, to the extent these are not in conflict with the specific terms and conditions of BBJ's this tender document. In case of conflict, the specific terms and conditions of this tender document will stand.

8. QUALITY ASSURANCE:

The agency will follow the respective specification of contract agreement between the Railways and BBJ (Particular pages are enclosed with this tender document). The approved QAP and WPSS / WPQR will be binding on the agency. The cost of test & inspection, as far as the scope of work of the agency goes, will be included in the agency's price.

9. INSPECTING AGENCY:

BBJ / E.C.Railway / RDSO / Railway's any other authorized representative.

10. BASIS OF ISSUE AND RECEIPT:

The issue and return of full size materials will be on the basis of theoretical weight (considering 7.85 Kg/Sq.M per MM thickness of Plate and Kg/M run as per Producer's Handbook for sections respectively) Return of scrap etc. will be on the basis of actual tare weight and subject to minimum quantity as elaborated in Clause 12. (b) of this tender document. In case otherwise or in the matter of any ambiguity, the decision of SIC/BBJ will be final and binding.

11. MATERIAL RECEONCILIATION:

- a) All endeavour to be made to restrict the wastage as minimum as possible.
- b) The agency will return all the BBJ's plant & machineries / materials (not consumed in work) to BBJ in good condition including empty paint drums.

- c)The agency will return all surplus and scrap to BBJ in place so designated by BBJ.
- d)The agency will hand over to BBJ the borings (out of drilling). However, no credit will be given to the agency on account of boring while reconciling the steel.

12. ALLOWABLE WASTAGE OF STEEL AND PENAL RECOVERY:
{ FOR BOTH HIGH TENSILE STEEL (HTS) & MILD STEEL (MS)}

The allowable wastage, without any penal measures, would be as follow:

- (a)Allowable wastage: 1.0% (One percent) of Material List weight of the respective girder components to be fabricated ;
- (b)Returnable Scrap/Off-cuts :The Sub-contractor shall be liable to return the scrap/off-cuts on weighment basis (tare weight) subject to a minimum quantity worked out as under:

“Quantity of issued material (based on theoretical weight as per Clause No. 10 above) less material list weight (ON NET SIZE) and less 1% (one percent) allowable wastage as given in Clause 12(a) above.”

PENAL RECOVERY WILL BE AS FOLLOW {FOR BOTH HIGH TENSILE STEEL (HTS) & MILD STEEL (MS)}:

In the event of the Sub-contractor fails to the minimum quantity of off-cuts/ scrap as mentioned in clause 12(b) above, BBJ shall be entitled to recover the amount arising out of the materials falling short @ the prevailing landed cost at Ganga Bridge Site, Munger (Bihar)+15% (as per chart given below) at the time of submission of final reconciliation statement.

To be decided as per provision of this contract. In case similar claim has to be raised on Railway, the approval / non-approval and it's mode (in case approved) will be only as per Railway's approval / non-approval. However, the decision of SIC/BBJ will be final and binding on the agency for all cases (admissibility, as well as rate).

(i) In case the matter is independent of Railways, payable rate will be actual cost of the agency (as per authentic documentary proof to be submitted by the agency) plus agreed % to be decided mutually towards all incidental, establishment, overhead and profit.

(ii) For cases to be considered by Railway, the agency's rate payable would be calculated after deducting 25% from Railway's approved rate towards BBJ's overhead and profit and there by further deducting BBJ's cost of material, plant etc. (if any) or (i) above, whichever is less.

15. MEASUREMENT FOR PAYMENT:

The measurement for payment will be considered as per approved material list. Calculations for payable weight will be as per theoretical weight of steel. No additional weight is payable for weld / rivet.

1. JOB QUANTUM

The quantum of fabrication work shall be around 9,780 MT(approx.) as already described.

- a) Fabrication need to be done to achieve proper camber profile. Necessary trial assembly/control assembly need to be done to satisfy the inspector as per relevant bridge code.

The tenderers should visit BBJ's drawing office on any working day (Monday to Friday, 10 A.M. to 1 P.M and 2 P.M. to 5 P.M) & Saturday (10 A.M to 1 P.M) for studying the drawings. BBJ reserves the right to alter/modify the drawing/specification to suit to their condition. If due to change in drawing/specification, there is any increase/decrease in items/quantities or both, payment will be made only for actual approved material list tonnage fabricated and certified by BBJ/E.C. Rly/their authorized agency. However, the payment will be restricted to the tonnage of girder components as per approved material list (Approved by BBJ /E.C.Railway).

3. DATE OF COMMENCEMENT

The date of commencement will be considered the date of issuance of LETTER OF INTENT (LOI).

4. RUNNING ACCOUNT BILL:

The agency will submit monthly RA bills with necessary documents like IC / Reconciliation statement etc. (as required and desired by BBJ) as necessary at BBJ's site office in Munger. Payment will be made within cv 30 days from the date of submission of the bill from BBJ HO. Deductions would be made from RA bills towards recovery of materials, statutory taxes & duties.

5. PAYMENT TERMS

I) FOR BUILT-UP SECTION:

- (a) 35% (thirty five) of item rate after fit-up assembly of member.
- (b) 25% (twenty five) of item rate after welding of member in final shape.
- (c) 30% (thirty) of item rate after drilling and obtaining I.C.
- (d) 5% (five) of item rate after erection.
- (e) 5% (five) of item rate after reconciliation.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

II) FOR INDIVIDUAL GUSSETS/SPLICE PLATES/PACK PLATES

- (f) 90% (ninety) of item rate will be payable after completion of fabrication and obtaining of I.C.
- (g) 5% (five) of item rate after erection.
- (h) 5% (five) of item rate after reconciliation.

6. EARNEST MONEY

The Earnest Money deposit of the successful bidder shall be retained towards part of the Security Deposit / Initial Security deposit to facilitate the due and faithful fulfillment of the contract.

7. SECURITY DEPOSIT

5%(five percent) of gross bill value from each RA bill of the agency will be deducted towards security deposit, which will be returned to the agency after completion of maintenance period and receipt of "no-claim" certificate from the agency and certification of reconciliation statement by SIC / BBJ, whichever is later.

8. MAINTENANCE PERIOD

The agency will require undertaking maintenance of its work for a period of 12 (twelve) months from the date of completion of work.

9. PRICE VARIATION

a) This is a fixed rate contract and no price variation / adjustment on any account is admissible (except price variation on account of labour as per following formula) during the tenure of the contract including extended time, if any granted by BBJ. RATES SHALL REMAIN FIRM TILL COMPLETION FOR THE ENTIRE SCOPE OF WORK.

b) PRICE VARIATION ON ACCOUNT OF LABOUR:

i) The rates for each item quoted by the Sub-contractor in his tender and accepted by BBJ shall hold good till completion of the work with adjustment as indicated in Clause 9.b) ii) below.

ii) METHOD OF CALCULATION OF ADJUSTMENT DUE TO LABOUR

The amount of adjustment i.e. increase/decrease in total payable amount shall be calculated by the formula for labour is given hereunder :

Where L = Amount of Price variation in Labour.

I = Average Consumer Price Index Number for Industrial workers All India - published in RBI Bulletin for the 3 (three) months of the quarter under consideration.

I_0 = Average Consumer Price Index Number for Industrial workers All India - published in RBI Bulletin for the base period.

R = Gross value of the work done by the Sub-contractor as per on account bills excluding cost of material supplied by BBJ.

BASE PERIOD = Month of placement of LOI.

QUARTER = Quarter will commence from three months following the month of placement of LOI.

NOTE : The price variation will be paid only for the original delivery period And not for any extended completion period granted by BBJ to the Sub-contractor on Sub-contractor's account.

10. TAXES & DUTIES

Sub-contractor's price should include all taxes & duties applicable for execution of the subject work.

11. LIQUIDATED DAMAGE

0.5% (half percent) per week of delay by the Sub-contractor subject to a maximum of 5% (five) of the order value.

12. TIME EXTENSION

If there is delay for reasons not attributable to the Sub-Contractor, BBJ, upon receipt of written request from the Sub-Contractor may extend the Completion time as may be required provided no L.D. is imposed on BBJ by E.C. Railway for such time extension. No extra claim (including escalation) of Sub-Contractor will be entertained in such cases of time extension.

13. CLAIM / EXTRA WORK

- a) No claim will be tenable in case there is delay in providing services by BBJ.
- b) In case any extra works are to be carried out by the Sub-Contractor as per instructions of E-I-C/BBJ, the rate of the same will be derived:
 - i) From the rate of the existing similar items;
 - ii) However, BBJ's decision for the above will be final and binding on the Sub-Contractor in this regard.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

14. IDLE CHARGES

No idle charges for Labour, Plant, Establishment etc. is tenable under this contract.

15. SUBLETTING

The Sub-contractor shall not sub-let any part of the job as detailed in the Scope of Work of this tender document. In case it is felt absolutely necessary, the same may be allowed subject to prior written approval from Fabrication-In-Charge / BBJ / Competent Authority of BBJ.

16. LABOUR LAWS & STATUTORY OBLIGATION

a) The Sub-Contractor will observe within the quoted rate all Statutory Obligation during execution of the work including Minimum Wages Act, Act covering P.F., E.S.I and other Statutory benefits under Workmen's Compensation Act, Contract Labour Regulation & Abolition Act 1970 & subsequent amendments and other Acts in force in the State of Bihar. BBJ will have no responsibility in this regard.

b) As compliance of Labour Laws & Statutory obligation is mandatory, the successful bidder(s) have to furnish compliance of the above laws by providing a CERTIFICATE as per enclosed format (ANNEXURE-II) along with the R.A. Bills. It may be noted that no bills will be eligible for payment unless and until the above certification is attached with the R.A. Bills. Moreover, being the Principal Employer, BBJ reserve the right to inspect the documentary evidence towards compliance of the above obligation under Labour Laws as and when necessary.

c) No residential accommodation/ boarding and food will be provided by BBJ for the Agency's workmen.

d) The Agency's manpower deployed at site will not to be involved in trade union activities in any manner.

17. ARBITRATION

In the event of any questions arising out of the Contract or ancillary/ incidental to the terms and conditions of it or relate to any matter for execution and/or performance of the contract, the same shall ip-so-facto be referred to the appropriate Authority and the interpretation made by the said authority shall be final and binding upon the parties.

Notwithstanding the above, should there be any, disputes or differences by and between the parties arising out of any thing under the contract, the same with in 30 days of it's occurrence shall first be referred to the said authority

SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

for conciliation and/or determination by the said authority if at all any disputes or difference is existing , the findings of the said authority should be accepted by parties to the contract, communicated in writing with in the next following 30 days of making reference to it .

Nevertheless, the parties at their sole option shall with in the next following 30 days choose to refer or cause the matter to be referred to the Arbitrator of Person in writing, whereupon the appropriate Authority shall with in two weeks hence shall take steps for appointment of Arbitrator of Person from amongst the officers whether or not connected in the matter and the same shall be communicated in writing to the parties making reference with in the next following two weeks and the same shall be final and binding upon the parties.

The Arbitrator shall enter into the reference by appropriate notice of communication to be served or cause the said notice to be served upon the parties summoning the respective parties to attend the proceedings at the date time and venue. The proceedings of Arbitration shall be at per with the Arbitration and Conciliation Act 1996 as amended up to date and jurisdiction of the matter shall be with in the appropriate Courts of Kolkata. Acceptance of Order/ LOI of the concerned agency shall be deemed to be the Free Consent given by party under the law towards execution of these covenants under the Contract of Arbitration.

18. RISK PURCHASE

TERMINATION OF CONTRACT

If the Sub-Contractor persistently disregard the instructions of BBJ/ E.C.RLY or whatever any of the providers of the contract and fails to adhere to the agreed programme by a margin of 10% (Ten) of the stipulated period or failed to deploy competent or additional staff and labourers as required by BBJ for project crashing, BBJ shall be at liberty terminate the contract in full or part as would be applicable by issuing first seven days and then 48 hours notice.

b)In case of failure to complete the fabrication as per requirement and within the stipulated completion period, B.B.J. reserves the right to cancel the order, either in part or full as the situation demands and get the work done by deploying other agency / agencies. Additional cost if incurred shall be recovered from the Sub-Contractor's bill and Security Deposit.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

19. JURISDICTION OF COURT

The Courts at Kolkata shall have the exclusive jurisdiction to try all disputes, if any, arising out of this agreement between the parties

20. GENERAL

In case certain clauses of SCC and GCC are found identical, the clause of SCC will prevail. However, if during the course of execution of job some development occurs and areas not covered elsewhere, the RELEVANT CLAUSES OF G.C.C will be applicable.

iii)	“OWNER”/“CLIENT” means EAST CENTRAL RAILWAY or their authorized representative.
iv)	The “SUB-CONTRACT” shall mean the notice inviting the tender, the tender and acceptance thereof and the formal agreement if any, executed between B.B.J. and Sub-Contractor together with the documents referred to therein including these conditions with appendices and any schedule of items, quantities and rates. All these documents taken together shall be deemed to form one contract and shall be complementary to one another.
v)	The “TENDER DOCUMENT” means the form of tender, the applicable schedule and/or additional conditions, the conditions and the specifications and /or drawings as referred to in the tender documents and as may be referred for the execution of works.
vi)	The “Works” shall mean the works to be executed in accordance with the contract or part(s) thereof as the case may be and shall include all extras of additional, altered or substituted works or temporary and urgent works as required for performance of the Sub-Contractor.
vii)	The “SUB-CONTRACTOR”/“AGENCY” shall mean individual or firm or company whether incorporated or not, undertaking the works and shall include legal representatives or such individual or persons composing such firm or unincorporated company, or successors of such firm or company as the case may be and permitted assigns of such individual or firm or company.
viii)	The “SUB-CONTRACT VALUE” shall mean the cost of works shown in the schedule of quantities as will be arrived on the basis of item rate quoted by the tenderers for various items.
ix)	A “DAY” shall mean a day of 24 hours from midnight to midnight irrespective of the number of hours worked in the day.

xi)	“FORCE MAJEURE” shall mean war, invasion, revolution, riots, sabotage, lockouts, strikes, work shutdowns imposed by Government Acts or Legislature or other authorities, act of God, epidemics, fires, earth-quakes, floods, explosions or any other acts or events whatsoever which are beyond the control of the Sub-Contractor and which shall directly or indirectly prevent the execution of work within the time specified in the agreement.
xii)	“SCHEDULE(S)” referred to in these condition shall mean the relevant schedule(s) of work and quantity annexed to the tender papers by B.B.J. or the standard schedule of rates prescribed by B.B.J. and the amendments thereto issued from time to time.
xiii)	The “SITE” shall mean the lands and/or other places on/under/in or through which the work is to be executed under the contract including any other lands or places provided by BBJ for the purpose of execution of the contract.
xiv)	“TEMPORARY WORKS” shall mean all the temporary works of every kind required for the execution, completion or maintenance of the work.

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xv)	“URGENT WORKS” shall mean any urgent measures which in the opinion of the Engineer-In-Charge, becomes necessary during the progress of the work to obviate any risk of accident or failure or which become necessary for security.
xvi)	A “WEEK” shall mean seven days without regard to the number of hours worked in any day in that week.
xvii)	“APPROVED” and “DIRECTED” means the approval or direction of the Managing Director, B.B.J. or the person authorized by him for the particular purpose.
xviii)	The “DATE OF COMPLETION” is the date or dates for completion of the work or any part of the works set out in or ascertained in accordance with the individual work order and the tender documents or any subsequent agreed agreement thereto.

If due to change in the drawing or design or for other reasons, there be variations, resulting in increase or decrease in quantities, payment will be made only for the actual quantities executed at the ordered rates. If there be sufficient cause, the B.B.J. may grant extension of the date of completion suitably. Such circumstance, shall in no way affect or vitiate the contract or alter the character thereof, or entitle the Sub-Contractor to damages or compensation there for except as provided for in this contract.
ii)	BBJ reserves the right to split the total quantity of work as mentioned in the B.O.Q. among 2 (two) or more agencies depending on the situation. The Agency cannot object or be entitled to any claim in the event of reduction in the actual quantity.
iii)	In the event of any reduction in the quantity OR OMISSION OF ANY ITEM IN THE B.O.Q. to be executed for any reasons whatsoever, the Sub-Contractor shall not be entitled to any compensation, but shall be paid only for the actual amount of work done.

iv)	The rate quoted by the bidder will stand unchanged in case of variation (+ or -) of quantities upto any extent.
v)	The quantities of each item of work furnished in the schedule are approximate and are intended for the guidance of tenderers / Sub-Contractors. In actual execution of work there may be some increase in the quantities specified, such variation shall in no degree effect the validity of the contract and it shall be performed by the Sub-Contractor as provided therein and be subject to the same conditions, stipulations and obligations originally and expressly included and provided for in the specifications and drawings and the amounts to be paid therefore shall be calculated in accordance with the accepted schedule of rates.
g)	<p><u>SEPARATE CONTRACTS IN CONNECTION WITH WORKS:</u> The B.B.J. shall have the right to let out our contracts in connection with the works. The Sub-Contractor shall afford to the other Sub-Contractors reasonable opportunity of storage of their materials and the execution of their work and shall properly connect and co-ordinate his work with theirs. 12.0	<p><u>TAXES, DUTIES AND OCTROI ETC.</u> The Sub-Contractor agreed to and hereby accept full and exclusive liability for the payment of any and all taxes, duties, octroi etc., now or hereafter imposed, increased, or modified, and all the sales tax, from time to time in respect of works and materials and all contributions and taxes for employment compensation, insurance and also age pension or annuities now or thereafter imposed on Central or State Government authorities which are imposed with respect to or covered by the wages/salaries or other compensations paid to the persons employed by the Sub-Contractor and the Sub-Contractor shall be responsible for the compliance with all obligations and restrictions imposed by the labour law or any other law effecting employer-employee relationship and the Sub-Contractor further agreed to comply, and to secure the compliance of all Sub-Sub-Contractor with all applicable Central, State, Municipal or local laws and regulations and requirements of any Central, State or Local Government agency or authority. Sub-Contractor further agreed to defend, indemnify and hold owner harmless from any liability or penalty which may be imposed by the Central, State or local authorities by reason of any violation or requirements and also from all claim suit of proceeding that may be brought against the owner arising under, growing out of or by reason of the work provided for by this Contract, by third parties, or Central or State Government authority or any other Sub-division thereof.</p>

19.0	<u>SANITARY ARRANGEMENTS</u> The Sub-Contractor shall obey all sanitary rules and carry out all sanitary measures that may form from time to time be prescribed by the concerned Medical Authority and permit inspection of all sanitary arrangements at all times by the Company's Site-In-Charge and/or his representatives.
20.0	<u>WELFARE & HEALTH</u> First Aid facilities to be provided as per specification laid down under Rules. Canteen facilities and Rest Room to be provided as per Rules.
21.0	<u>MEDICAL FACILITIES AT SITE</u> The Sub-Contractor shall provide medical facilities at the site as may be prescribed by the Engineer-In-Charge in relation to the strength of the Sub-Contractor's resident staff and workmen directly or through the petty Sub-Contractors or sub-Sub-Contractors employed on the work. First Aid facilities at site should be as prescribed under C.L. (R&A) Act and Rules.
22.0	<u>OUT BREAK OF INFECTIOUS DISEASE</u> The Sub-Contractor shall remove from his camp such labour and their families who have protective inoculation and vaccination when called upon to do so by the Engineer-In-Charge or the Engineer-In-Charge's representative.
23.0	<u>PRESERVATION OF PEACE</u> The Sub-Contractor shall take requisite precautions and use his best endeavours to prevent any riotous or unlawful behaviour by or amongst his workmen and other employed directly or through the petty agencies on the works.
24.0	<u>USE OF INTOXICANTS AT WORKSITE AND ENCAMPMENTS FOR THE WORK</u> The sale of ardent spirits or other intoxicating beverages on the work site or in any of the buildings, encampments or tenements owned, occupied by or within the control of the Sub-Contractor or any of his employee directly or through the petty Sub-Contractors or sub-Sub-Contractors employed on the work shall be forbidden and the Sub-Contractor shall exercise his influence and authority to the utmost extent to secure strict compliance with this condition.
25.0	<u>NON EMPLOYMENT OF FEMALE LABOUR AT SITE:</u> The Sub-Contractor shall see that the employment of female labour directly or through the petty agencies employed on the work at Site should be avoided.
26.0	<u>NON-EMPLOYMENT OF LABOURS BELOW THE AGE OF 15</u> The Sub-Contractor shall not employ children below the age of 15 as labours directly or through the petty Sub-Contractors or sub-Sub-Contractors employed on the work for the execution of the work.
27.0	<u>EMPLOYMENT OF LABOUR FROM SCARCITY AREA</u> If the Government declares a state of scarcity of famine to exist in any village situated within 10miles of the work, piece worker/Sub-Contractor shall employ upon such parts of the work as the suitable for unskilled labour any person certified to him by the Engineer-In-Charge or by any other person to whom the Engineer-In-Charge may have delegated this in writing to be in need to relief and shall be bound to pay to such person wages not below the minimum which Government may have fixed in the behalf. Any dispute which may arise in connection with the implementation of this clause shall be decided by the General Manager (Projects) whose decision shall be final and binding on the piece worker/Sub-Contractor.

<p>28.0</p>	<p><u>INSURANCE</u> Sub-Contractors shall at his own expense carry and maintain insurance with reputable Insurance Companies to the satisfaction of the Owner as follows:-</p>
<p>a)</p>	<p><u>EMPLOYEES STATE INSURANCE ACT</u> The Sub-Contractor agrees to and does hereby accept full exclusive liability for the compliance with all obligations imposed by the Employee State Insurance Act, 1948 and Sub-Contractor further agrees to defend, indemnify and hold owner harmless from any liability or penalty which may be imposed by the Central, State or local authority by the reason or any asserted violation by Sub-Contractor or Sub-Contractor of the Employee's State Insurance Act, 1948 and also from all claims, suits or proceedings that may be brought against the owner arising under, growing out of or by reason of the work provided for by this contract.</p> <p>Sub-Contractor agreed to fill in with the Employee State Insurance Corporation, the declaration forms and all forms, which may be required in respect of the Sub-Contractor's or Sub-Contractor's employee, where aggregate remuneration is Rs.660.00 per month or less who are employed in the work provided of those covered by ESI from time to time under the Agreement. The Sub-Contractor shall deduct and secure the agreement of the Sub-Sub-Contractor to deduct the employee's contribution as per the first schedule of the Employee's State Insurance Act from wages and affix the Employee's contribution cards at wages payments intervals. The Sub-Contractor agrees to maintain all cards and records as required under the Act in respect of employees and payments and the Sub-Contractor shall secure the agreement of the Sub-Sub-Contractor to maintain such records. Any expenses incurred for the contributions, making contributions of maintaining records shall be to the Sub-Contractor's or Sub-Contractor's account. The owner shall retain such sum as may be necessary from the total Sub-Contractor value until the Sub-Contractor shall furnish satisfactory proof that all contributions as required by the Employees State Insurance Act, 1948 have been paid. This will be pending on the Sub-Contractor when the Employee's State Insurance Act is extended to the place of work.</p>
<p>b)</p>	<p><u>WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION AND EMPLOYER'S LIABILITY INSURANCE</u> Insurance shall be effected for all the Sub-Contractor's employees engaged in the performance of this contract. If any of the work is sublet, the Sub-Contractor shall require the Sub-Sub-Contractor to provide workmen's compensation and employee's liability insurance for the latter's employees, if such employees are not covered under the Sub-Contractor's insurance.</p>
<p>c)</p>	<p>Sub-Contractor shall be responsible for making good to the satisfaction of the owner any loss or any damage to structure and properties belonging to the owner or being executed or procured or being procured by the owner or of other agencies within the premises of all the works of the owner, if such loss or damage is due to fault and/or the negligence or wilful acts or omission of the Sub-Contractor, his employees, agents, representative or Sub-Sub-Contractor.</p>
<p>d)</p>	<p>The Sub-Contractor shall take sufficient care in moving his plants, equipments and materials from one place to another so that they do not cause any damage to third party including overhead and underground cables and in the event of any damage resulting to the property of the owner or of a third party during the movement of the aforesaid plant, equipment or materials the cost of such damage including eventual loss of production, operation or services in any plant or establishment as estimated by the owner or ascertained or demanded by the third party shall be borne by the Sub-Contractor.</p>

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e)	The Sub-Contractor shall indemnify and keep to the owner harmless of all claims for damages to property other than owner's property arising under or by reason of this contract if such claims result from the fault and/or negligence or wilful acts or omission of the Contract, agents representatives or Sub-Sub-Contractor.
f)	<u>ANY OTHER INSURANCE REQUIRED UNDER LAW OR REGULATIONS OR BY OWNER</u> Sub-Contractor shall also carry and maintain any other insurance, which he may be required under law or regulation from time to time. He shall also carry and maintain any other insurance, which may be required by the owner.
g)	<u>ACCIDENT OR INJURY TO WOKMEN</u> The owner shall not be liable for or in respect of any damages or compensation payable at law in respect or in consequence of any accident or injury to any workmen or other person in the employment of the Sub-Contractor or any Sub-Sub-Contractor save and except an accident or injury resulting from any act or default of the owner, his agent or servants and the Sub-Contractor shall indemnify and keep indemnified the owner against all such damages and compensation (save and except as aforesaid) and against all claims, demands, proceedings, cost charges and expenses whatsoever in respect or in relation thereto.
h)	<u>TRANSIT INSURANCE</u> In respect of all items to be transported by the Sub-Contractor to the site of work, the cost of transit insurance should be borne by the Sub-Contractor and the quoted price shall be inclusive of the cost.
i)	The Sub-Contractor must submit a photocopy each of the above Insurance Policies to the Site-In-Charge/BBJ, GANGA Bridge Site before commencement of the work.
